I. The examiners shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for such necessary expenses as are approved by the Court and charged to the Verde Ditch Company.

II. Examiners' duties are as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached to the Order signed and filed herein this date.

III. Before submitting their report to the court, the examiners shall submit a draft thereof to counsel, pursuant to Rule 53(j).

IV. The examiners as officers of this Court, which Court is the Master of the Verde Ditch, shall stand in the position of the Master with respect to attorney-client and accountant-client privilege regarding affairs of the Verde Ditch Co. Communications between the examiners and the Commissioners appointed by the Court to manage the Verde Ditch and the Ditch Company attorney, accountant and all records pertaining thereto shall retain that confidentiality and privilege provided by the law.
