. 10-Jul-2024 Petitioner Hayes, pro se, filed a "Motion for Procedural Order for Extension of Time to File Petition for Review." In his motion, he included the three court of appeals' case numbers shown above.

The court of appeals issued its decision in 1 CA-CR 20-0141 on April 8, 2021, and the mandate issued on November 2, 2021. The court of appeals dismissed case number 1 CA-CR 24-0186 PRPC on April 3, 2024 as untimely, noting that the trial court had dismissed the petition for post-conviction relief on August 29, 2023. The court of appeals also dismissed case number 1 CA-CR 24-0190 PRPC on April 8, 2024 as untimely, again noting that the trial court had dismissed the petition for post-conviction relief on August 29, 2023.

Under Ariz. R. Crim. P. 31.21(b)(2)(A), unless a motion for reconsideration has been filed, a petitioner must file a petition for review within 30 days of the court of appeals' decision or seek an extension before the expiration of the 30-day period. Petitioner's challenges to each of the court of appeals' decisions in these three proceedings are therefore untimely. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED denying the "Motion for Procedural Order for Extension of Time to File Petition for Review."

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED dismissing this proceeding as untimely. (Hon. Kathryn H. King)
