- 2. 17-Jan-2024 FILED: On January 10, 2024, Petitioner Mike Palmer submitted this rule petition seeking to abrogate Rule 25(g) of the Arizona Rules of Protective Order Procedure, which authorizes a court to prohibit a defendant from possessing, purchasing, or receiving firearms for the duration of an injunction against harassment. The petition further requests "Emergency adoption," which is implicitly is asking for: (a) expedited consideration of the petition in advance of the Court's August 2024 Rules Agenda under Rule 28(h)(1) of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Arizona; and (b) adoption the petition's proposed rule change on an emergency basis under Rule 28(h)(2) of the same rules. This order addresses the first part of the petitioner's request. Upon consideration and finding that the petitioner has not shown "compelling circumstances" as required by Rule 28(h)(1),

IT IS ORDERED that the petitioner's request for expedited consideration is denied.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the petition will be opened for public comment later this month and that the Court will consider the petition during its August 2024 Rules Agenda. (Hon. Robert Brutinel)
